Two options to dispose of unused medications....



Drug Take Back Program

Sponsored by the North Dakota Attorney General



ACCEPTED:

Unused or expired prescriptions or over-the-counter medicines, including

- Pills, tablets, caplets
- Inhalers, nebulizer solutions
- Liquid medicines any amount (leave in container)

• CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES:

- **Pain relief**, such as Vicodin, Hydrocodone, OxyContin, Fentanyl, Demerol, etc.
- Anti depressants, such as Valium Zoloft, Prozac, etc.
- Sleep aids, such as Ambien, Lunesta, Sonata, etc.
- To safeguard patient confidentiality, PRODUCT SHOULD BE REMOVED FROM THE CON-TAINER.

DEPOSIT MEDICATIONS IN THE SECURE CON-TAINER AT PARTICIPATING LAW ENFORCE-MENT AGENCIES. NO QUESTIONS ASKED!

Unused or expired prescriptions or over-the-counter medicines, including

ACCEPTED:

- Pills, tablets, caplets
- Ointments, creams, lotions and powders
- Inhalers, nebulizer solutions
- Liquid medicines \leq 4 oz.

NOT ACCEPTED: Controlled substances, such as: Vicodin, Hydrocodone, Valium and others.

Deposit these **controlled substances** in the **TAKE BACK containers at participating law enforcement agencies.**

• PRODUCT SHOULD BE LEFT IN THE ORIGI-NAL PACKAGING AS DISPENSED.

MEDICATIONS MAY BE DEPOSITED IN THE DROP BOX AT PARTICIPATING PHARMACIES.

NOT ACCEPTED BY EITHER PROGRAM: Any sharps (such as syringes, lancets), thermometers, glass, home based care (HBC) or durable medical equipment (DME) supplies and pharmacy inventory. Ask your pharmacist where to safely dispose of these items.
