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INTERDISCIPLINARY CARE

○ TEAMWORK!

- For the last 12 years the SHARING Clinic has been the interdisciplinary care outlet for health care students at the University of Nebraska Medical Center.
- A once-a-week opportunity for students to work as a team to care for the underserved and teach each other.

○ Early Practice Experience

- An opportunity for students to use what they learn in the classroom in a real life situation.
- It forces/allows the students to think quickly on their own, while still having teachers and mentors present.

SHARING STAFF

- ◉ Medical Students
- ◉ Physician's Assistant Students
- ◉ Nurse Practitioner Students
- ◉ Pharmacy Students
- ◉ Physical Therapy Students
- ◉ Dietetic Students

SHARING STAFF

- Each week licensed physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, and pharmacists are present to oversee the students and guide decisions in therapy.
- The licensed professionals give interprofessional guidance to the students and to each other.

SHARING Board

○ SHARING Board members

- The board is comprised of students of each school involved in the clinic.
- These students really have to learn to work together to keep the clinic running.

A NIGHT AT SHARING

- Patient arrives for 6pm appointment
- Med/PA/APRN student is assigned to the patient; pharmacy student that reviewed the med history is included. Any other disciplines needed are included.
- Patient interview is conducted.
- As a group the students make an assessment and present the patient and their assessment to the faculty.

A NIGHT AT SHARING

- Faculty may want to see patient.
- Students and faculty make clinical decisions.
- Patient is informed of plan and agrees to therapy
- Medications are prescribed and/or dispensed
- Pharmacy students counsel on medications if needed
- A follow up appointment is scheduled.

Why SHARING?

- SHARING gives students the real life experiences we crave.
- Extra learning opportunity.
- Desire to serve others.
- Preparation for the future.
