President Tanya Schmidt, PharmD called the meeting to order on Thursday July 19, 2018 at 10:00 AM in the Conference Room of the Board of Pharmacy Office, 1906 East Broadway in Bismarck, ND.

President Schmidt read the mission statement: *The Board of Pharmacy protects, preserves and promotes the public health and welfare of the citizens of North Dakota by assuring that the highest quality pharmaceutical care is delivered and that appropriate use of pharmaceuticals is upheld through education, communication, licensing, legislation, regulation, and enforcement.*

President Schmidt administered the Oath of Office to new member Tyler G Lannoye, PharmD and he was congratulated and welcomed by all.

It was moved by Technician Member Diane Halvorson and seconded by Public Member Fran Gronberg to seat Tyler G. Lannoye, Pharm D, on the Board of Pharmacy. On vote by roll call Pharmacist Ziegler-Aye, Technician Halvorson – Aye, Public Member Gronberg – Aye, Pharmacist Wendel – Aye Pharmacist Irsfeld – Aye, Pharmacist Schmidt – Aye. Nays none – the motion carried.

It was moved by Pharmacist Gayle Ziegler and seconded by Pharmacist Steve Irsfeld to approve the agenda with additions of CBD oil, ASHP/ACPE Technician program accreditation standards and District V delegate selection as discussion items. On vote by roll call Pharmacist Ziegler-Aye, Pharmacist Lannoye-Aye, Technician Halvorson – Aye, Public Member Gronberg – Aye, Pharmacist Wendel – Aye Pharmacist Irsfeld – Aye, Pharmacist Schmidt – Aye. Board members signed original certificates for use as new pharmacists are licensed and pharmacy technicians are registered.

Derek P Axtman, Intern # Int437 arrived at the meeting to address the Board Members. Executive Director Hardy reviewed Intern Axtman's situation of a pre-pharmacy student intern at NDSU and received an alcohol related conviction. Derek explained that he has met with Agnes Harrington of the PharmAssist committee, had a substance use disorder evaluation and Agnes has recommended no contract for him. He meets with Dr. Friesner monthly, has completed community service and has attended two AA meetings which have helped him understand how alcohol can ruin your life.

Nathan Fleck, PharmD Owner/Pharmacist-in-Charge of Northland Nuclear Medicine dba Hot Shots Nuclear Medicine, LLC Pharmacy Permit Phar686 arrived to discuss the relocation plans for his pharmacy. Board members took the opportunity to quiz pharmacist Fleck to learn a great deal about nuclear pharmacy. One of the reasons for the move is to accommodate the 90,000 pound cyclotron particle accelerator Nathan has obtained from a UND research program for use in manufacturing radioactive dosages. He will have a manufacturing facility physically separated from his pharmacy at his new pharmacy location.

It was moved by Technician Diane Halvorson and seconded by Pharmacist Gayle Ziegler to approve the plans and relocation of Northland Nuclear Medicine dba Hot Shots Nuclear Medicine, LLC Phar686 from 2124 E Thayer Ave to 1815 Michigan Ave in Bismarck. The USP 800 task force was discussed before Pharmacist Steve Irsfeld had to leave the meeting. It will meet in August and address areas of potential concern in the Chapter that may impact pharmacy operations, to make recommendations to the Board.

Dr. Hardy explained his perspective of the DEA clarification on CBD oil. That there appears to be a distinction between Hemp derived oil and Marijuana Plant derived oils. The DEA makes it clear that the CBD content in Hemp Oil should be minimal. In reference to pharmacies being solicited to sell products marketed as CBD Oils, Dr Hardy has cautioned against this due to the DEAs guidance.

Pharmacist Steve Irsfeld left the meeting for another obligation.

Dr. Hardy reviewed the 2018-2019 financials and 2017-2018 end of year vs budget comparisons. Questions were asked and answered about the over budget items of the law suit, the PDMP enhancement contract and the credit card fees.

It was moved by Public Member Fran Gronberg and seconded by Technician Diane Halvorson to approve the financials as presented, after explanations were heard. The upcoming District V NABP/AACP meeting in Saskatoon was discussed. With two of our ND Board Members: Technician Diane Halvorson and Pharmacist Shane Wendel, putting their hats in the ring for nomination to the NABP executive committee, no other members are making the trip. President Schmidt appointed Mark Hardy to serve as our delegate to the meeting.

Dr. Hardy reviewed the lawsuit between PCMA vs Tufte and the amount of money the board has spent so far. He noted that we are currently waiting for the District Court to make their determination on the case.

Fran Gronberg left the meeting at 4 PM.

Discussion of the Drug shortage problems and possible action centered on use of the states managed inventory at the emergency warehouse and a current discussion that is in process to increase the amount of IV fluids / critical medications on hand.

Executive Director Hardy mentioned NarxCare and the possibility we might incorporate into the PDMP at a later date, if a grant would be approved.

Dr. Hardy explained that Compliance Officer Anderson is working on updates of our Wholesale, DME and Medical Gas inspection forms.

Discussion followed about the inspection process for the current cycle.

There was discussion about how the two tiered Technician training through ACPE/ASHP might impact North Dakota. Our techs are now mostly trained at the higher level and if we decide to stick with that, how will we treat a technician coming from another state that is both certified and registered there. It was agreed that we should check out what other states are planning and put this item on the September agenda.

President Schmidt adjourned the meeting at 4:30 PM .
