President Carolyn R Bodell, RPh, called the Board Meeting to order at 10 AM on Thursday November 20, 2025.

Present in the Room were Executive Director Mark J Hardy, PharmD, Technician Member Diane Halvorson, RPh Tech; Tanya Schmidt, PharmD; Carolyn Bodell, RPh; Shane Wendel, PharmD; Kevin Oberlander, Rph, and Public Member Ron Horner; Howard C Anderson Jr RPh; and Tyler Lannoye, PharmD, and interns Sarah Richman and Natalie Schuh. Also in the room were Gabe Lautenschlager, Pharm D with CVS and Essam Abdelmonem, who is seeking an Intern License.

Present on Zoom were Sarah Cronin, Inspector Gayle Ziegler and Mark Johnston of CVS and Seth Oberlander PIC at CVS in Grand Forks.

President Bodell read the mission statement: *The Board of Pharmacy protects, preserves and promotes the public health and welfare of the citizens of North Dakota by assuring that the highest quality pharmaceutical care is delivered, and that appropriate use of pharmaceuticals is upheld through education, communication, licensing, legislation, regulation, and enforcement.*

It was moved by Technician Diane Halvorson and seconded by Pharmacist Tyler Lannoye to approve the agenda with the addition of the North Central Human Service Center remodeling request, the White Drug #46 addition and review of the final 2024-2025 audit report. On vote by roll call Technician Diane Halvorson-Aye-Pharmacist Tanya Schmidt-Aye-Pharmacist Shane Wendel-Aye-Pharmacist Tyler Lannoye-Aye-Pharmacist Kevin Oberlander-Aye-Public Member Ron Horner-Aye- and Pharmacist Carolyn Bodell-Aye-. The motion carried.

It was moved by Pharmacist Tanya Schmidt and seconded by Pharmacist Kevin Oberlander to approve the Minutes of the September 18, 2025, meeting, as printed. On vote by roll call Technician Diane Halvorson-Aye-Pharmacist Tanya Schmidt-Aye-Pharmacist Shane Wendel-Aye-Pharmacist Tyler Lannoye-Aye-Pharmacist Kevin Oberlander-Aye-Public Member Ron Horner-Aye- and Pharmacist Carolyn Bodell-Aye-. The motion carried.

Pharmacist Donna Bieri and Technician Rodney Yellow Bird (Tech 2219) joined the Board via Zoom. Donna requested that Technician Yellow Bird, who has been registered since August, be allowed to work alone as the Telepharmacy Technician at their Parshall location. Technician Yellow Bird stated that he was comfortable working alone in both pharmacies. Donna said Parshall does 25-30 prescriptions a day.

It was moved by Technician Diane Halvorson and seconded by Pharmacist Tanya Schmidt to grant an exception to the rule and allow Rodney Yellow Bird (Tech 2219) to work alone in the Telepharmacy at their Parshall location. On vote by roll call Technician Diane Halvorson-Aye-Pharmacist Tanya Schmidt-Aye-Pharmacist Shane Wendel-Aye-Pharmacist Tyler Lannoye-Aye-Pharmacist Kevin Oberlander-Aye-Public Member Ron Horner-Aye- and Pharmacist Carolyn Bodell-Aye-. The motion carried.

Pharmacist Seth Oberlander, PIC for CVS in Grand Forks joined the Board via Zoom and along with Gabe Lautenschlager District Leader for CVS to request an intern license for Essam Abdelmonem, a graduate from an Egyptian pharmacy school who had completed the Foreign Pharmacy Graduate Equivalency Examination Certification process in 2016. Board members discussed Essam's history in practice. He had a

pharmacy on the Red Sea in Egypt and also worked in Italy where he felt the practice of pharmacy was well advanced. He spent the two years caring for his father, who had cancer.

It was moved by Pharmacist Tanya Schmidt and seconded by Pharmacist Tyler Lannoye to grant Essam Abdelmonem an Intern License for the purpose of completing the 1500 hours required to be eligible for a pharmacist license in North Dakota. On vote by roll call Technician Diane Halvorson-Aye-Pharmacist Tanya Schmidt-Aye-Pharmacist Shane Wendel-

Aye-Pharmacist Tyler Lannoye-Aye-Pharmacist Kevin Oberlander-Aye-Public Member Ron Horner-Aye- and Pharmacist Carolyn Bodell-Aye-. The motion carried.

Pharmacist Taylor Enger joined the Board via Zoom and explained the request to relocate the Mountrail County Medical Center Pharmacy in Stanley to a new location within the existing building. They are expanding by adding a sterile compounding area and planning for a possible hazardous drug compounding area in the future. Board members asked questions about the primary engineering controls necessary for the planned compounding areas. Taylor responded that the buildout would take a couple of years. Dennis Dellabarre has reviewed the plan and will have more follow-up opportunities in the spring.

It was moved by Technician Diane Halvorson and seconded by Pharmacist Tyler Lannoye to approve the relocation plans for Mountrail County Medical Center Pharmacy (PHAR178) in Stanley. They will need to return for approval if they decide to proceed with a hazardous compounding area. On vote by roll call Technician Diane Halvorson-Aye-Pharmacist Tanya Schmidt-Aye-Pharmacist Shane Wendel-Aye-Pharmacist Tyler Lannoye-Aye-Pharmacist Kevin Oberlander-Aye-Public Member Ron Horner-Aye- and Pharmacist Carolyn Bodell-Aye-. The motion carried.

At 11:10 AM Dr. Hardy reviewed the Stipulation and Settlement Agreement signed by Valerie Salvaggio RPh6566. She has not been practicing since the complaint was served on her license. She does have an active contract with the PharmAssist Committee.

It was moved by Pharmacist Shane Wendel and seconded by Pharmacist Kevin Oberlander to approve the Stipulation and settlement agreement with Valerie Salvaggio RPh6566. On vote by roll call Technician Diane Halvorson-Aye-Pharmacist Tanya Schmidt-Aye-Pharmacist Shane Wendel-Aye-Pharmacist Tyler Lannoye-Aye-Pharmacist Kevin Oberlander-Aye-Public Member Ron Horner-Aye- and Pharmacist Carolyn Bodell-Aye-. The motion carried.

Pharmacist Tanya Schmidt disclosed that she works for Thrifty White and would not vote but did explain the plans for repurposing additional space at Thrifty White #46, 706 38th St NW, Suite B in Fargo, ND to provide better counseling and patient service areas in the pharmacy.

It was moved by Technician Diane Halvorson and seconded by Public Member Ron Horner to approve the additional space for Thrifty White #46, 706 38th St NW, Suite B in Fargo, ND. On vote by roll call Technician Diane Halvorson-Aye-Pharmacist Tanya Schmidt did not vote, Pharmacist Shane Wendel-Aye-Pharmacist Tyler Lannoye-Aye-Pharmacist Kevin Oberlander-Aye-Public Member Ron Horner-Aye- and Pharmacist Carolyn Bodell-Aye-. The motion carried.

Dr. Hardy reviewed draft 25.1.386.01000 of legislation prepared for the Rural Health Transformation Committee. Board members appreciated the draft and it was noted that it would like go in front of a special legislative session in 2026. Board member discussed suggested the possibility of future authorities

including Schedule V authorities like in other states and the ease of interchanging biosimilars. The prescribing of "drug classes" was questioned in the draft.

Dr. Hardy passed out meeting notices for the next District V meeting to be held in Minnesota, pointing out the meeting days have been changed to Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

At noon, the Board broke for lunch and the Investigative Committee met during lunch. The Board reconvened at 1:00 PM.

Pharmacist Amy Johnson, PharmD, explained the plans to change the room designated as the pharmacy at the North Central Behavioral Health Clinic in Minot, ND. They decided to downsize the space as they do only a couple of prescriptions a month now and can use the existing room for other care.

It was moved by Technician Diane Halvorson and seconded by Pharmacist Kevin Oberlander to approve the changes at the North Central Behavioral Health Clinic, (PHAR607) in Minot, ND, stipulating that the drugs be stored in locked cabinets. On vote by roll call Technician Diane Halvorson-Aye-Pharmacist Tanya Schmidt-Aye-Pharmacist Shane Wendel-Aye-Pharmacist Tyler Lannoye-Aye-Pharmacist Kevin Oberlander-Aye-Public Member Ron Horner-Aye- and Pharmacist Carolyn Bodell-Aye-. The motion carried.

Dr. Hardy discussed the positive ID requirements in light of the move by states to issue a digital ID for mobile device, and whether or not that will work for controlled substance identification. He presented an email question and his answer. Board members agreed that a digital ID could be used for positive ID requirements.

Dr. Hardy reported that two of the 340B lawsuits have been consolidated but the AstraZeneca one has a different track currently. The Attorney General's office and our assistant attorney generals continue to work on the suits.

Board members reviewed the 2024-2025 audit report.

It was moved by Pharmacist Tyler Lannoye and seconded by Pharmacist Tanya Schmidt to approve the 2024-2025 audit report as presented. On vote by roll call Technician Diane Halvorson-Aye-Pharmacist Tanya Schmidt-Aye-Pharmacist Shane Wendel-Aye-Pharmacist Tyler Lannoye-Aye-Pharmacist Kevin Oberlander-Aye-Public Member Ron Horner-Aye- and Pharmacist Carolyn Bodell-Aye-. The motion carried.

Board member reports: Pharmacist Carolyn Bodell detailed on a report she came across on pharmacies in North Dakota. Technician Diane Halvorson reviewed some of the Community Health Worker (CHW) information reported at the recent CAP symposium. Pharmacist Shane Wendel reported on the recent weeklong meeting at NABP where executives, inspectors and legal counsels got together. Pharmacist Kevin Oberlander reported on some legislative and regulatory changes in compounding practices.

It was moved by Pharmacist Tanya Schmidt and seconded by Technician Diane Halvorson to approve all the legal actions of the Executive Director. On vote by roll call Technician Diane Halvorson-Aye-Pharmacist Tanya Schmidt-Aye-Pharmacist Shane Wendel-Aye-Pharmacist Tyler Lannoye-Aye-Pharmacist Kevin Oberlander-Aye-Public Member Ron Horner-Aye- and Pharmacist Carolyn Bodell-Aye-. The motion carried.
