NDCC 28-32-08 – Regulatory Analysis relative to amendments and adoption of rules in NDAC 61

- 61-02-07.1-07 Pharmacy Technician Registration Requirements - creates administrative code based upon Senate Bill 2306 for a provisional registration for current members of the military or their spouses
- 61-03-01-04 Pharmacist Licensure Transfer - creates administrative code based upon Senate Bill 2306 for a provisional licensure for current members of the military or their spouses
- 61-04-08 Limited Prescriptive Practices - Repealed based on changes made by Senate Bill 2231
- 61-04-11 Administration of Medications and Immunizations – revised the standards and authorities based on changes made by House Bill 1498

Neither the Governor, nor a member of the Legislative Assembly has filed a written request for a Regulatory Analysis for these rules.

The proposed rules are not expected to have an impact on the regulatory community as a whole in excess of \$50,000. The regulated community consists of pharmacies, interns, pharmacists and pharmacy technicians practicing in the State. These Rules are intended to change administrative code in response to Legislative Bills passed in the 2019 66th Legislative Assembly.

The proposed rules will affect both Pharmacists and Pharmacy Technicians engaged in the professional practice outlined in the rules.

The Board of Pharmacy will be impacted specifically in its implementation of the rules for the licensure and registration of military members and their spouses. The Board will adjust licensure and registration Applications and processes to accommodate the law changes. Also the process for Administration of Medications certification will be abandoned for a separate administrative process to authorize a pharmacist to administer medications.

We anticipate the cost to be fairly minimal and will not have any effect on the state revenues or those collected by the State Board of Pharmacy.
